### **Treasurer's Report**

#### **Presentations**

MORPC | Brooke White, Senior Air Quality and Sustainability Specialist

Brooke White shared information about the Franklin County air quality monitoring project, which will monitor for particle air pollution at select sites across central Ohio. This type of pollution has been linked to heart and lung diseases and more severe outcomes with COVID-19. The goal is to assess disparities in pollution and identify environmental justice issues across the county. MORPC is seeking input from communities on monitor placement; 2 monitors have been dedicated to our zip code.



Homeowners or businesses can host a monitor. Monitors are small and can be attached with zip ties, but require access to Wifi and an external power outlet. Commissioner Neale has suggested several locations on the far south side, including near Georgia Pacific, Sherwin Williams, 2505 Groveport Road, and the Cambria neighborhood. Ideal locations are located east-northeast of known polluters. Commissioners were invited to share additional suggestions and contact information for business or home owners who express willingness to participate.

#### **CV21-027 and BZA21-024** (399 Haul Rd.)

Commissioner Walcott introduce Laura Comek, representing Columbus Limestone, Inc. The rezoning is to enable Columbus Limestone to store vehicles for sale (not junk) in an area adjacent to an active work site. Mature trees screen the area in question, which is distanced from neighbors on Shelley Dr. BZA21-024 is a special permit to allow a temporary trailer to serve as an office.

Laura Comek shared that Columbus Limestone, Inc. will be generating 21 jobs on the south side in a variety of capacities, and will update the Commission as jobs become available.



Motion by Commissioner Walcott to approve BZA21-24, special permit for 399 Haul Rd. to allow Columbus Limestone, Inc. to erect a temporary trailer to serve as an office. Seconded by Commissioner Neale. Motion Passes.

#### **Z21-012** (3469 S. High St.)

Michael Pogoda and Jim Jakubus representing Pogoda Companies explained Z21-012, which would rezone the property at 3469 S. High St. from C4 to LM. This rezoning would allow the existing business to add 20,000 square feet of exterior self-storage facilities, as exterior storage is not allowed under C4. Jim Jakubus spoke to questions presented at the Zoning meeting regarding safety and security in the surrounding area.

Motion by Commissioner Walcott to approve Z21-012 for 3460 S. High, Z21-012, to allow for exterior self-storage facilities. Seconded by Commissioner Draudt. Motion passes.

Commissioner Sherman shared an idea from the South Side Area Commission for self-guided Commissioner training. The example shared by Beth Fairman Kinney covered topics like implicit bias, Zoning laws, redlining, environmental concerns, neighborhood history, and more.
